The Classical Approach

With a classical curriculum, the steps to learning are clear. There's a process and a well-thought-out plan. So, for example, the themes your middle schooler is studying in history will appear in art class, too.

With this approach, your child becomes capable of understanding complex concepts in more and more areas of their life.

At CCA, we use that understanding to:

Develop Critical Thinking. As part of a classical education, students learn through Socratic discussions and are trained in analysis and feedback, formal logic is taught in eighth grade.

Teach Self-Assessment. Our teachers help students understand the end goal of each unit or course. Then, your child learns to analyze their own strengths and weaknesses before moving to the next unit or course.

Practice Safe Digital Use. Technology is a powerful tool for learning, so we incorporate smart boards, interactive LED panels, iPads, and other devices as needed to enhance the educational experience. However, we are always mindful of digital health and safety.

Emphasize Autonomy. As students mature, we add developmentally appropriate responsibilities such as tracking their own homework and communicating with teachers. By seventh grade, they gain the freedom to move between buildings and decide on their own enrichment classes and athletic participation.

Encourage Goal Setting. Study skills are integrated into classes through the use of planners and by teaching how to prepare for tests and take notes. In eighth grade, a guidance counselor also begins working with students.

Complete Preparation for a Lifetime of Growth

When you think about college preparation and career readiness, your mind likely goes directly to academics. That's a great place to start, but your child needs more than that to have a future full of possibilities.

Your middle schooler will find academics that are second to none at Covenant Christian Academy. Our classical, Christian program will guide them through foundational subject areas and build the critical-thinking and research skills they need to shine in high school and college.

But, on top of college-prep academics, we also help your child thrive through:

Enriched Learning

Middle school is the perfect time for your child to discover a variety of new interests and passions. Some of our students' favorite electives include applied technology, drama, choir, strings, and art.

Competitive Athletics

On or off the field or court — we're always proud of our athletes. Our Cougars play hard and have helped develop the character of a very long line of CCA graduates. We offer 15 team sports, new athletic facilities with turf and a weight room, two regulationsized gymnasiums, an athletic trainer, and a strength and conditioning coach.

Location

Where is the campus? Our middle school is located on 16 acres in suburban Colleyville, right in the heart of the Dallas/Fort Worth Metroplex. Most of our students live within a 10- to 15-minute radius of our school.

Schedule

How does a school fit into your family's schedule? CCA's school day runs from 8 a.m. to 3:15 p.m., Monday through Thursday, and until 2:30 p.m. on Fridays. We offer after-school care through sixth grade, extending the day until 5:30 p.m.

Communication Expectations

How does communication work between the home and the school? CCA partners with parents to ensure there is a strong connection between each child's home and school. We offer a weekly newsletter, LMS, and plenty of available conference times for families and teachers.

Growth Opportunities

What happens when your child makes a mistake and needs some guidance? We believe discipline is about training the heart — not just the behavior. When students understand why something is wrong, a heart change is promoted, and character is formed. We also celebrate and encourage positive actions.



JOIN THE CONVERSATION A CHANCE TO INVOLVE YOUR MIDDLE SCHOOLER

As your child grows from elementary to middle school, their influence should increase, too. They have opinions — and ideas — about their own education. Let's take what they have to say into consideration before you make a final decision.

1. Be intentional and ask specific

questions. Try asking your child about an interest or subject they would like to develop further, rather than broad questions such as, "What school do you want to go to?" Then, if they are really interested in theater and joining your church's worship team, help them look for a school that has a strong arts program and a chapel service that invites student participation.

2. Help your middle schooler research.

Show them the school websites and parent information packets that you've collected. Then, work together to create a list of your family's priorities and have your child compare each school. This gives them the opportunity to practice critical thinking — an important skill they will strengthen in middle school. 3. Show that you are open to other perspectives. Be curious, but not critical. Ask questions that push your child to clarify their thoughts. How do you think that relates to choosing a school? Why do you think a strong athletic program is important? You'll be modeling good communication skills and gaining valuable insight into what your child really needs in a school.

4. Pray with them and for them.

Remind them that you — and God take their concerns about friendships, new teachers, and changing schools seriously. Ask for God's guidance and blessing on your child's future.
